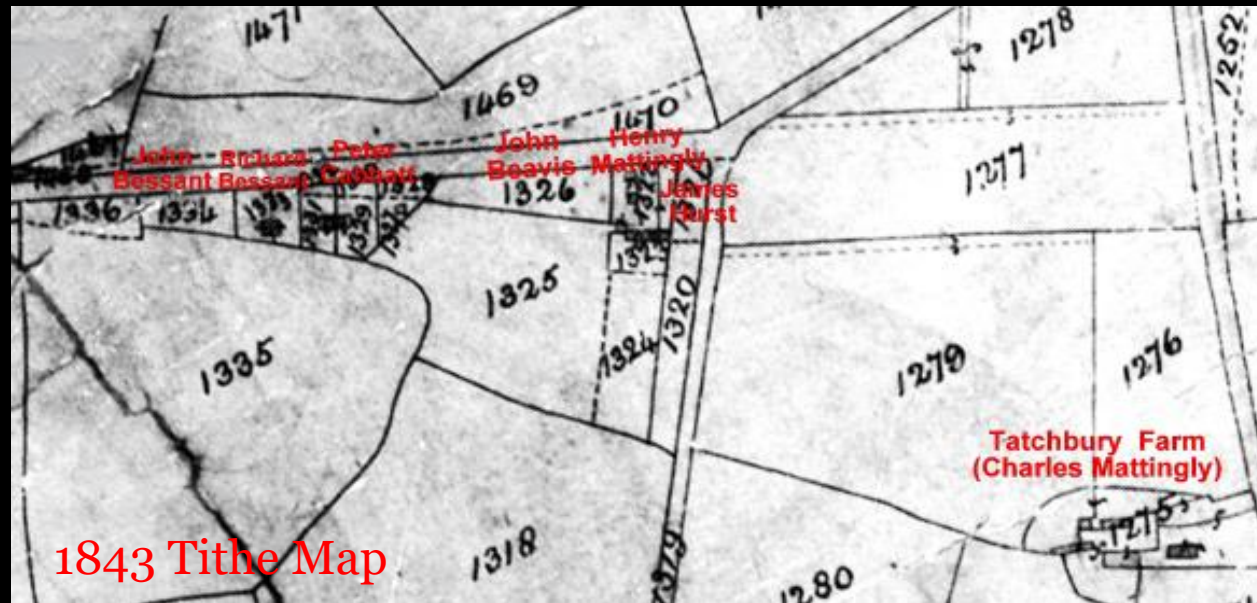
The 1871 Census shows Henry, now aged 57, living with his wife Ann, much older at 68 at the same cottage at Calmore He is described a formerly being a Groom who is now an Invalid. His brother Charles is living near by at Tatchbury Lodge, with his wife Anne and his sister Jane, who is unmarried.

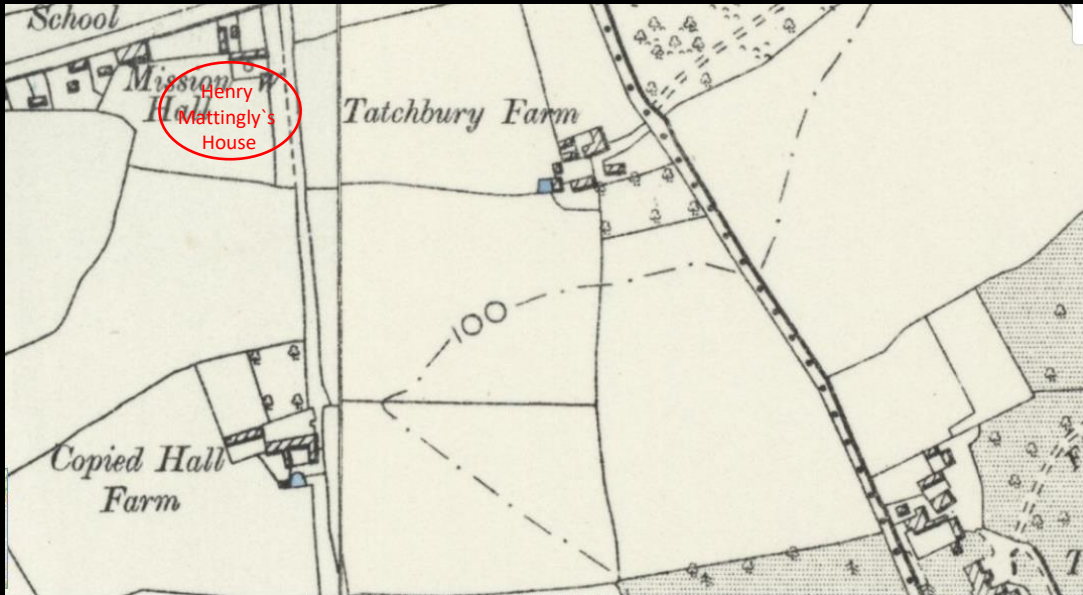
1843 Tithe Map

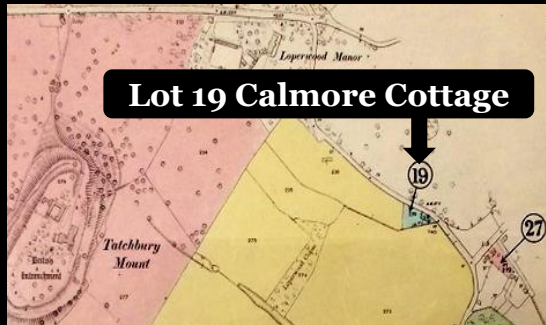

The 1881 Census shows Henry Mattingly living at Calmore Cottage with his neighbour James Budden. He had occupied this cottage from 1851, when he had moved from nearby Winsor. He lived in half of Calmore Cottage, shown in the accompanying photos in 1928 when it came up for auction and today. The other half was occupied by the Budden family for over 50 years according to the Auction details, when it was sold for £275.

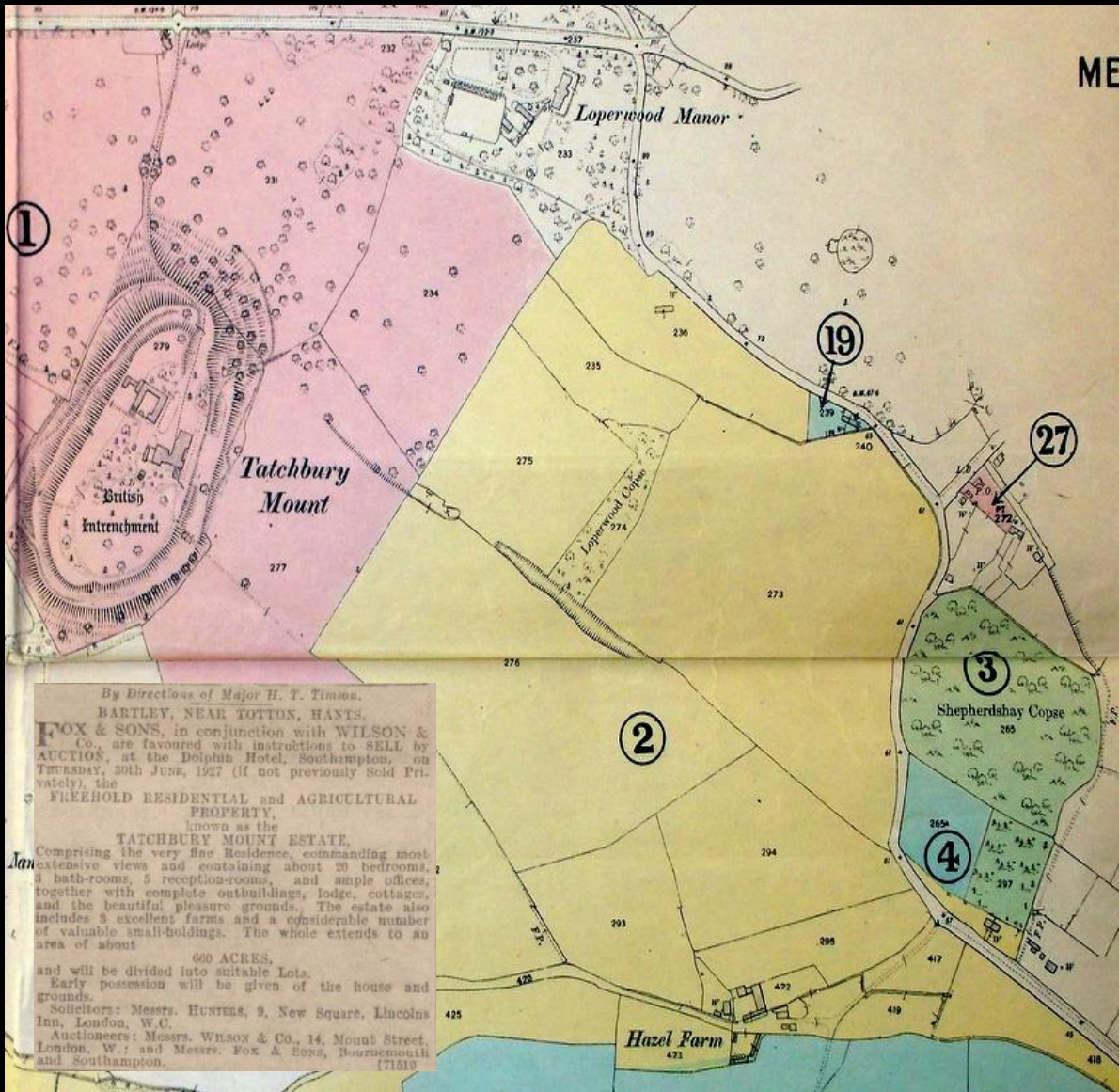
Married in the *Church*, according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church, by *James* by me.

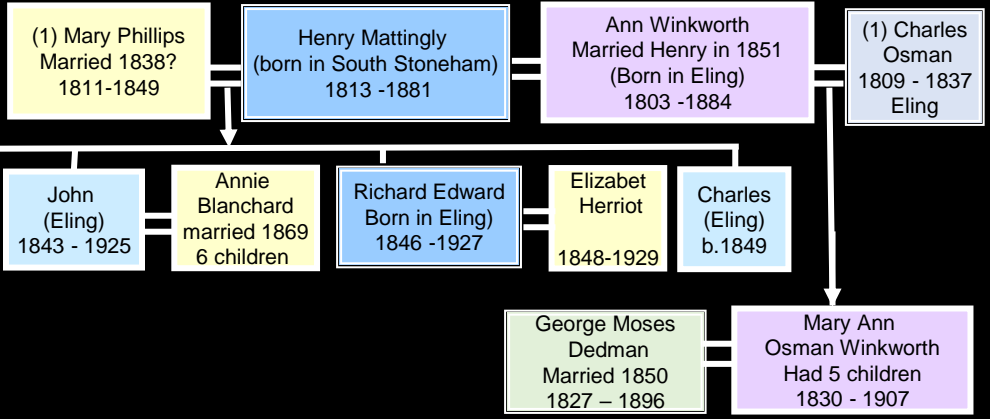

The Death Certificate for Henry Mattingly for the 21st June 1881 describes him as a Farm Labourer aged 65 living at Calmore, (near Eling). Mary Ann Dedman, his daughter in law, living at Winsor, near Eling leaves her mark.
