


Birth Certifiacte dated 21st April 1846 for Richard son of Henry and Mary Mattingly (formerly Phillip) at Calmore in Eling.

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St. Judes Church. Whitechapel.


The 1861 Census shows Henry Mattingly (aged 48) is living with his second wife Ann (aged 59) at Calmore, Eling with his two sons, John (aged 16) and Richard (Aged 14). They are all described as Agricultural Labourers. Soon after he rises to the position of Coachman and his son Richard as Footman. His two eldest sons are working as Coachmen in Kensington in London by then.

In 1868 Richard, aged 22 marries Elizabeth Herriot, aged 20 at St. Jude's Church in Whitechapel (shown here). He is described as Footman residing at 50 Sussex Square in Brighton. Elizabeth is the daughter of Glassford Herroit, a Brass Finisher living at 8 Chapel Street in Whitechapel.








Shakespeare Road. Brixton as it was.



Old Map of Mansion House Street and Kennington Park Road




On the 24th December 1910 Rose Mattingly, daughter of Richard Mattingly, Farmer, marries Charles Grimble

Beech Croft House, near Hattingley today showing the original house that Richard would have known on the left.




65 Ferndale Road today is the first house on the right with the blue door.
