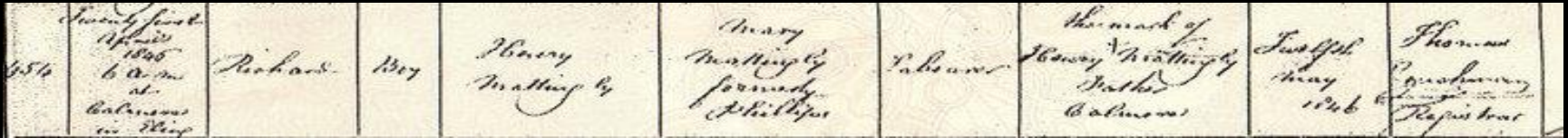

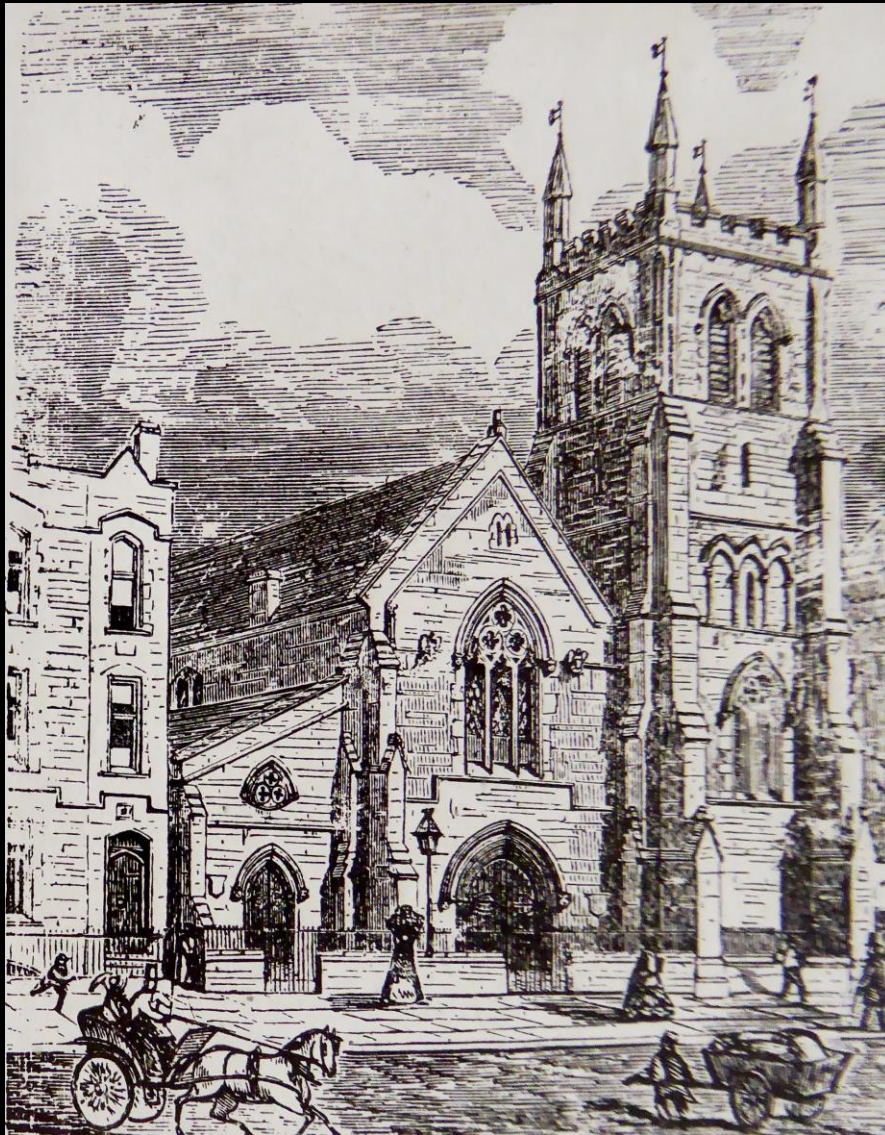


Calmore Cottage – home of Henry Mattingly (1813 -1881), Loperwood Lane, Eling SO40 2RL today

They are all described as Agricultural Labourers. Soon after he rises to the position of Coachman and his son Richard as Footman. His two eldest sons are working as Coachmen in Kensington in London by then.

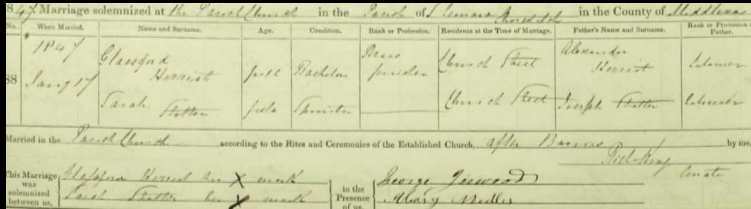

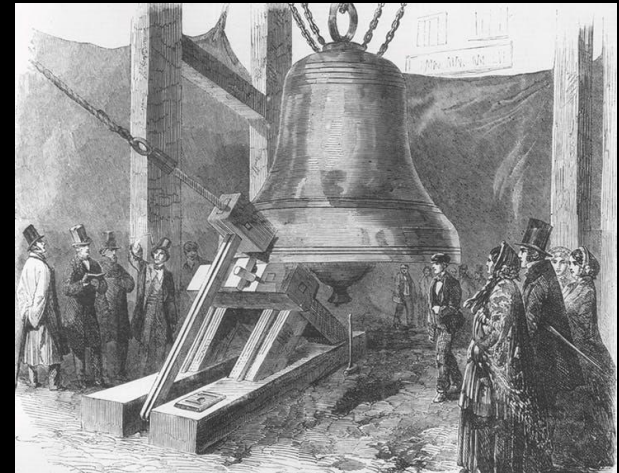
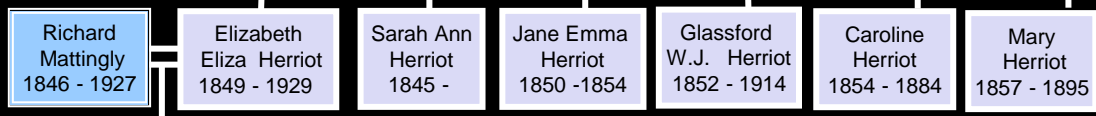

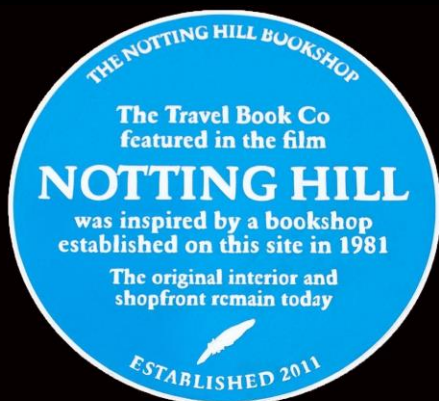

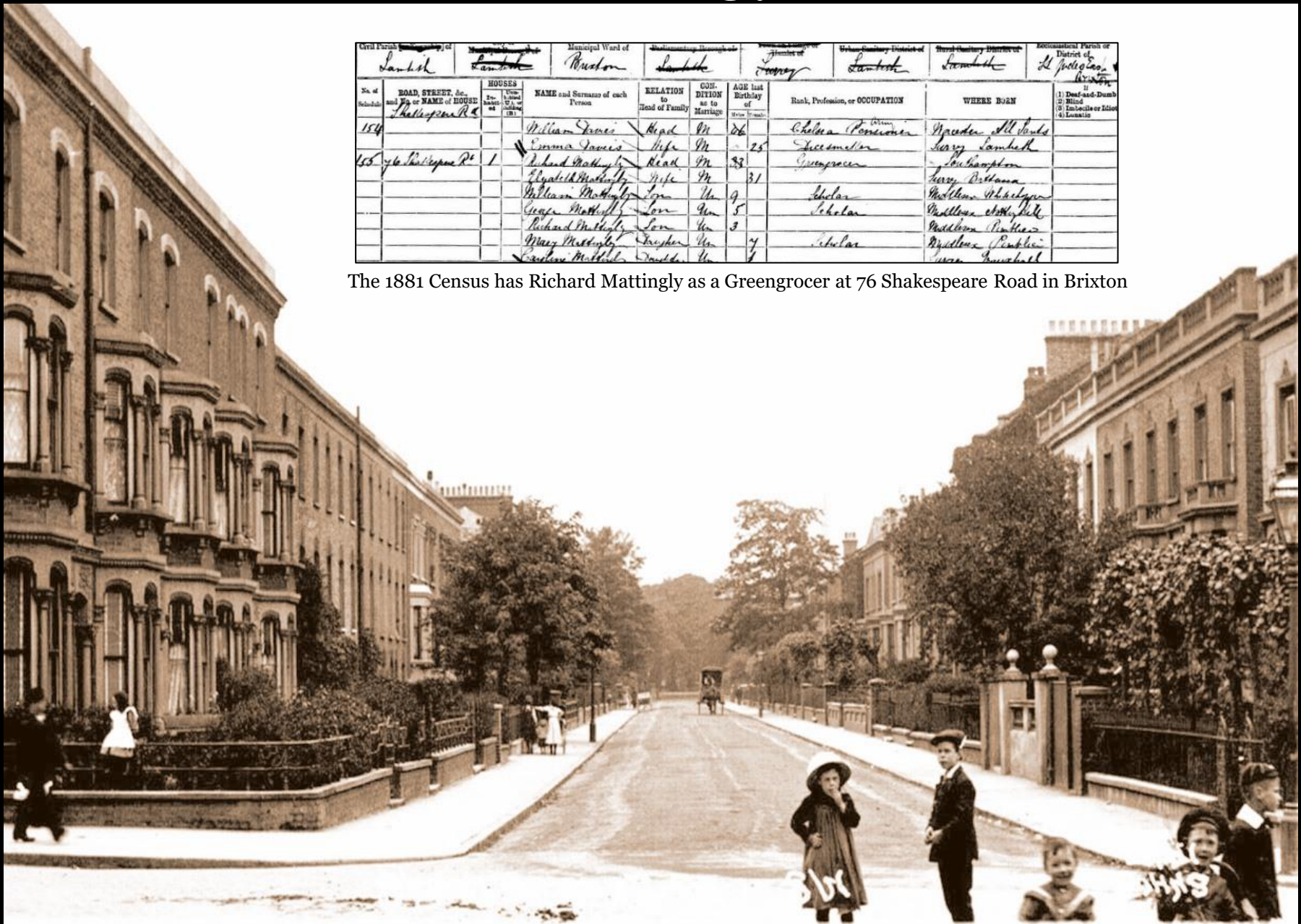

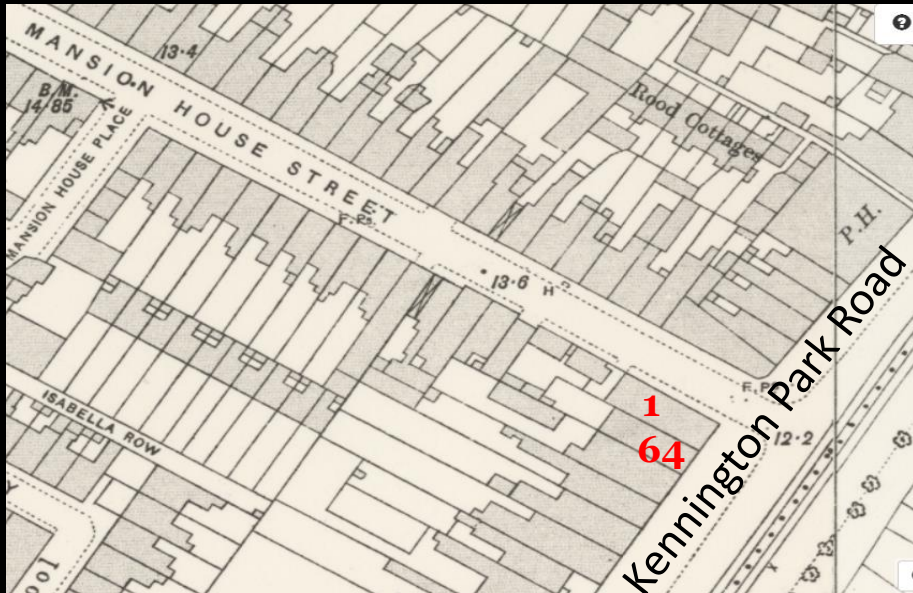
