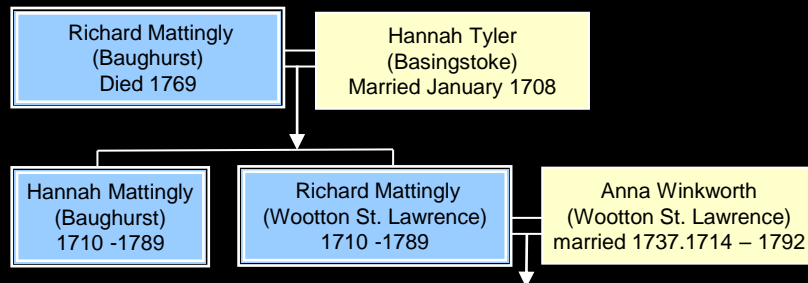


1. Richard Mattingly

Richard Mattingly originally lived in Kingsclere, but moved to nearby Baughurst. The original Settlement certificate, signed by the Church Wardens has survived. He married Hannah Tyler in 1708 at St. Michaels Church in Basingstoke. They had at least two children –Richard born in 1710 and Hannah born in 1720. Richard appears on the list of Voters for the village in 1734 and dies In Baughurst in 1769
